This was followed with a guided tour of ASDA House, including a visit to the intriguing 'Secret






Darwin's Galapagos Finch Evolution

History - Fountains Abbey

On July 4th Year 7 ventured out in the pouring summer rain to Fountains Abbey. Fountains Abbey and Studley Royal Water Gardens are a National Trust property, a drive of just over an hour away to the north, near Ripon a strictly outdoor venue!

We all put up umbrella's, jackets, rain coats and ponchos, and hoped for the best. A few students (and staff!) in shorts and T Shirt resolved NEVER to go out without a coat again!

However, by 11.30 the soaking was over, and we were treated to glorious sunshine and blue skies: Perfect for the photo competition!

The abbey was founded in the 1132CE by 13 monks hoping to escape the bustling city of York. They soon settled, becoming expert at building, land management, fishing, and along with their lay brothers (labourers!) also founded a highly successful wool industry in the valley. Students

learned about the abbey, the life of a monk, and the dissolution of the monasteries under the rule of Henry VIII.

In addition to the abbey, the grounds are also a fantastic example of water garden architecture from the 1700s, and Year 7 enjoyed a rather invigorating walk around the follies and view points above the River Skell. Miss Brigg's group were also very lucky in the deer park, sighting a herd of deer, some with fawns hidden in the under growth.
