Academic Success

We have now become accustomed to our leading position in the North of England and so it was particularly gratifying to be recognised nationally this year for our GCSE results. We now rank second in the country for state, coeducational schools and in the top 20 when compared to all 6000+ secondary schools in the private and state sector. Along with our A level grades being in the top 20% nationally, it has been another very pleasing year, enabling our wonderful students to go on to even greater things, given the grounding they had at HGS. With anticipated excellent results again for this summer, we look forward to the new ranking later in the year.

Site Developments

We have another busy summer ahead with significant investments in our facilities. The finishing touches to the remodelled middle yard, will include the installation of 2 large canopies to give protection from extremes of weather and also create an outdoor performance space for performing arts. It will look quite different when students return in September. Additionally, boys and girls toilets are being remodelled and renewed, and we have extensive works on the older part of the building's roof.

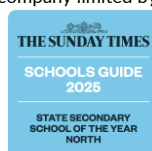
Extra- Curricular

Attendance

I'm pleased to say our overall attendance is in excess of 96% which is a pleasing statistic and significantly above local and national benchmarks. The information contained is purely for your information and may help you, when having to make difficult judgement decisions about whether your child should attend school.

Ofsted

As you will recall we were inspected earlier in the term and we communicated we were pleased overall with the team's findings. We are still awaiting the final report which we now understand should be available in September.

End of Year and New Year Arrangements

As is our usual custom, school will close early on Friday 17 July at 12.15pm after a final assembly.

School reopens on Wednesday 2 September at 8.40am for years 7 and 12 and Thursday 3 September for all other year groups.

School will finish at 2.25pm on Friday 11 September to enable us to prepare for the entrance examination, which will be held on Monday 14 September, when the school will be closed to students all day.
